Offering a broad and balanced curriculum to our pupils is so important and our work with Dorset Music Service is a key part of that.

It has also been great to see James Longcake and Steph Martin-Papp's small group / individual music lessons becoming so popular. I am delighted about the growth of this kind of provision in addition to the sporting and creative clubs on offer. We are seeing so many children broadening their interests and maximising these extra-curricular opportunities - which is a crucial element of their personal development. Hopefully there are further opportunities to represent the school in the pipeline too, as I'm working on a potentially very exciting sporting partnership with Dumpton.







Comic Relief and Courageous Advocacy

One of the things we encourage and develop as a church school is courageous advocacy among our staff and pupils (the championing of a cause which is special to that person). In the feedback from our SIAMS inspection earlier in the year we were encouraged to enable the children to take more ownership of what causes to pursue, which is why the Comic Relief event was such a perfect one for us to utilise. Watching and listening



to the children tell their peers and the staff all about their 'best idea ever', and how it solved a problem they were passionate about, was joyous. The passion with which they spoke for helping others or the environment; and the creativity that they had shown in designing and building their ideas blew us away. To my mind it was courageous advocacy in its truest form and I was so impressed by the children's maturity too - they all seemed about a foot taller and 5 years older in that moment.

This was then followed up with another example of pupils championing a

cause that is important to them. Our Eco

Ninja team spent a lunchtime working together out on Pamphill Green as part of the Great British Spring Clean. We're so lucky to be in such a beautiful, clean area but the children were still able to fill a bin bag with plastic waste to help our local environment - well done to Mrs Legge and the Eco-Ninjas, you made a big difference.



Easter, Worship and Perseverance



Through worship, we have continued our work around having **the courage to persevere** so that we can **shine like stars**. In the build up to Easter we are now focussing more specifically on the end of Jesus' life and Holy Week. We have also welcomed 'Captain Kev' who is based out of St. John's Church in Wimborne to tell the story of Jesus's perseverance when resisting temptation in the desert, and how that links with lent for Christians today.
