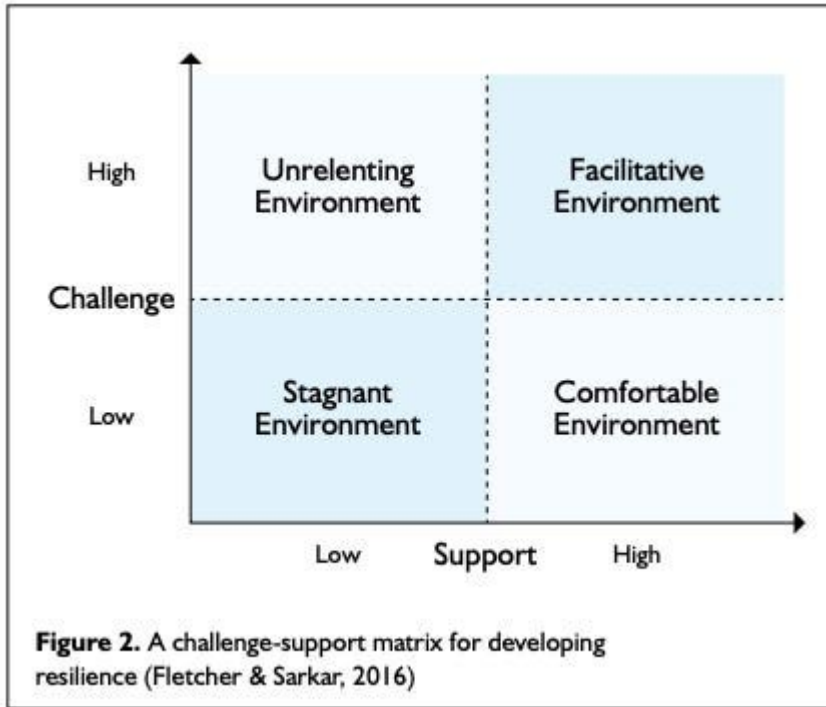

We can show **love** and **courage** at Pamphill through:

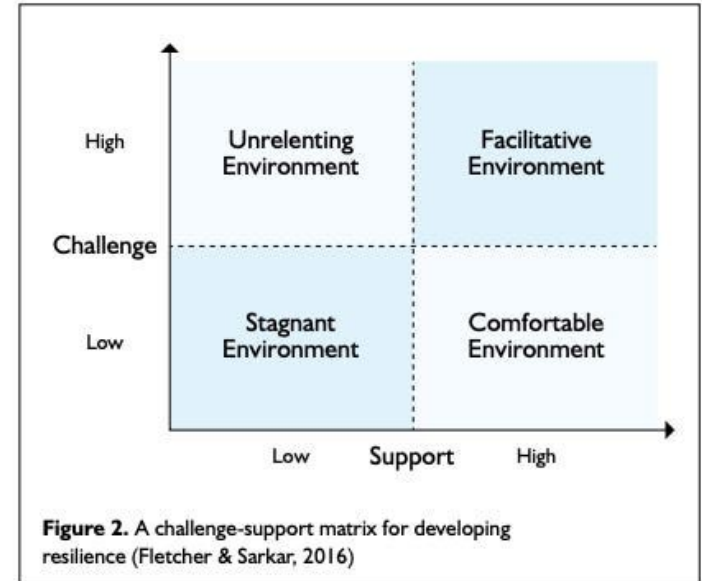
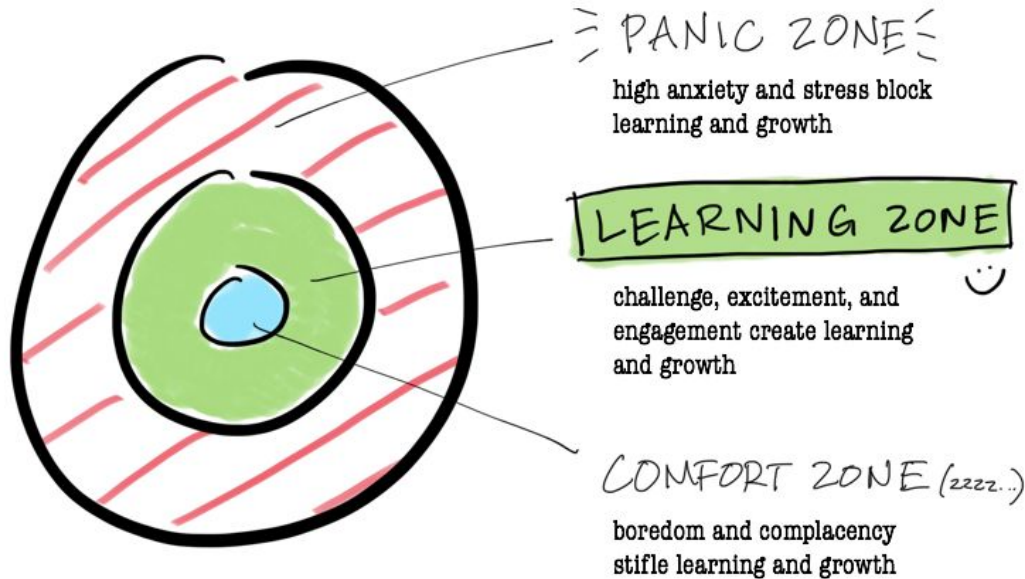
-  **Perseverance** (having the **courage** to try your best)

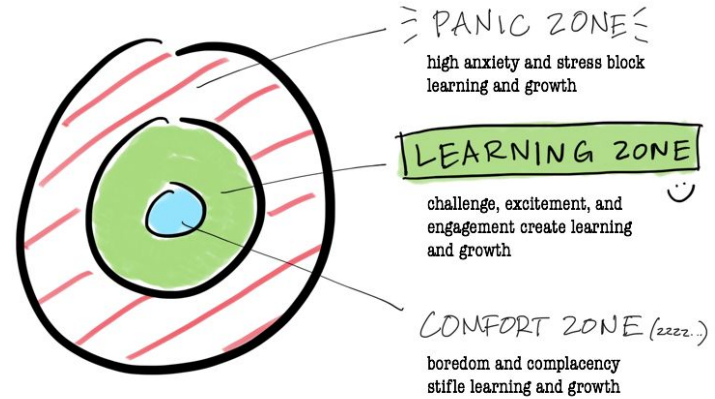


We still have room to grow...









Pupil behaviour can still improve to positively impact the learning opportunities for all. There's no hiding from the fact that one pupil's behaviour affects the others.

- High expectations
- Children need boundaries.
- Sometimes they like to test where they are (some more than others).
- But what they are often doing is checking the reliability of their environment, they want to feel safe and secure, supported and challenged.
- Firm kindness: clear expectations that are explained to them; praised when they're met and followed up when they're not.

Parenting / Raising children

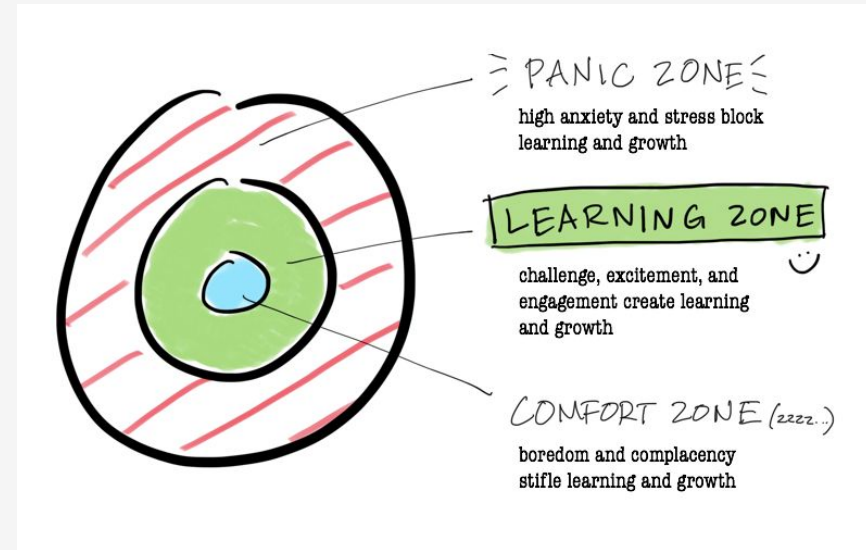
Good parenting is:

- 30% getting it right
- 30% getting it wrong then putting it right
- 40% hit or miss

If the boundaries are clear and consistent then you're already winning. Warm Strict / Firm Kindness is setting those expectations and following through.

When that's not the case:

- Children are hyper aroused or disassociated - regardless there's high stress and learning is being blocked.
