Reading at Home

Two of our classes have enjoyed their first prizes for class reading today - ice creams at school!!! Each class is set a target equating to every child reading 3 times a week at home. We use the reading records to monitor this. Unfortunately Stags are starting to lag behind having only met their target once in the last month.

Regular reading with experts (adults) is so important and we cannot make the progress the children deserve alone. Every week the children come home with a 'love of reading book' that they have chosen from the library as well as a book that matches their current ability. The latter is designed to help the children improve their fluency, which is why

reading the same book multiple times (in younger years) is an important part of the process. These books are only changed if the children have read them, again, this is monitored weekly through the reading records. If you have any further questions, please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher who will be happy to support.

Attendance

It has been a fantastic start to the year on this front so thank you for all of your efforts, we set an ambitious target of staying over 96% and we are currently sat on 96.8% - which is great news and means that as many children as possible are benefitting from uninterrupted learning sequences. The challenge will now be keeping this up through the winter!

Parking

Just a quick thank you to you all for responding to the new arrangement outside of the front of the school so positively, there has been a marked improvement in safety out there and I just ask that we continue not to park alongside the fence to keep the corner past the building clear for traffic.
