




Read the parable of the Good Samaritan...



A man was travelling from Jerusalem to Jericho. He was all alone, he was on foot and it was a very dangerous route. All of a sudden, some robbers leapt out from their hiding place, stole the man's money, beat him up and left him by the side of the road.

Shortly after, another man walked down the same road. He was a very important priest at the temple, but he just took one look at the man, crossed to the other side of the road and walked on by.

Not long afterwards, another figure appeared. He was a Levite, someone who also worked at the temple, someone who you'd expect to help. So what do you think he did? Rush to help the poor man? No, he did exactly the same thing as the priest, he crossed to the other side of the road and walked straight past!

Much later third man came down the road and he was riding on his donkey. This man was a Samaritan. The Samaritans did not get on at all well with the other people around them. Did the Samaritan walk on by and ignore the man who had been hurt by the robbers because he was not a Samaritan? No, he felt so sorry for the man that he rushed over to him, bandaged his wounds, helped him on to his donkey and took him to an inn in the next village. He gave the innkeeper some money to look after him until he was well again.

Jesus looked straight at the man who had asked him the tricky question and said, 'Which of the men do you think was a neighbour to the man who had been robbed: the priest, the Levite or the Samaritan?' I suppose it was the Samaritan', replied the man. 'You have answered correctly,' said Jesus. 'A neighbour is anyone who needs your help, so now you need to go and help you neighbour, too!'
